Warden Lois Landry called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

2. Opening Acknowledgement

The Warden made the following opening acknowledgement:

We are gathered today on Unama'ki, the Land of Fog, a part of Mi'kma'ki, the unceded traditional territory of the Mi'kmaq people, since time immemorial. We honour and thank the Mi'kmaq for sharing their land and home with us.

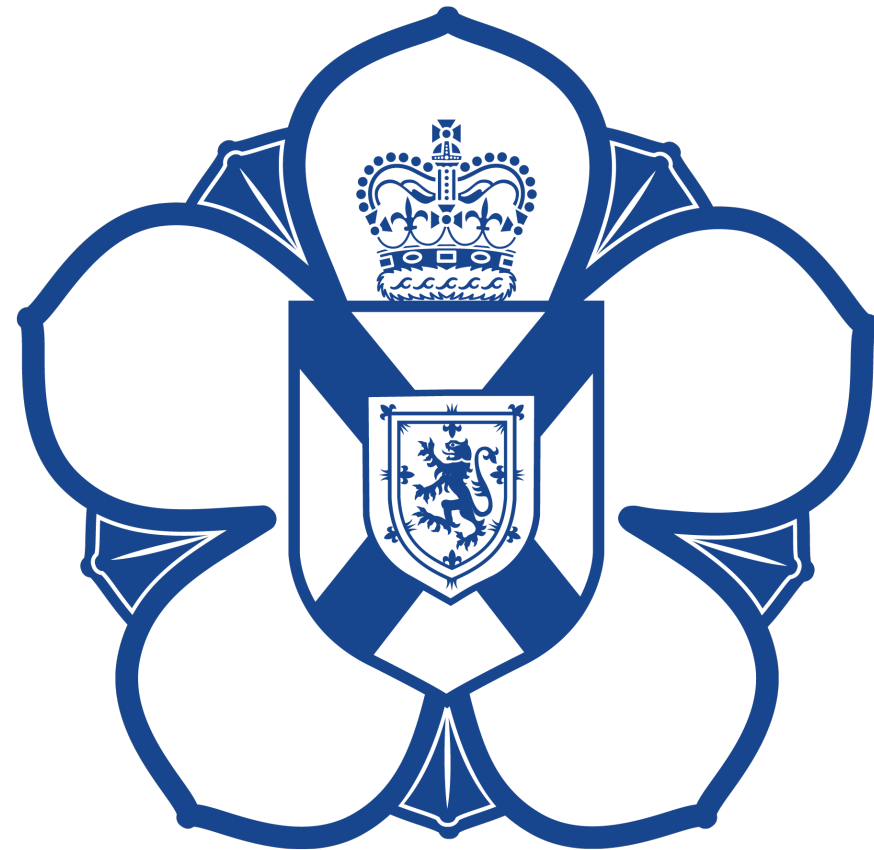

The Order of Nova Scotia



What is the Order of Nova Scotia?



- The Order of Nova Scotia is the highest honour of the Province of Nova Scotia
- It was established in 2001
- Encourages excellence by recognizing Nova Scotians for outstanding contributions or achievements
- Fields recognized by this honour include the arts, academics, research, agriculture, business, industry, community leadership, public service, and volunteer service

Who is eligible for the Order?

- Anyone who has an association with Nova Scotia
 - They do not have to be born here or to live in the Province
 - They must have made a significant contribution to Nova Scotia
- Politicians and judges may not be nominated while serving in office
- Only individuals may be nominated (no groups or organizations)
- The Order may be conferred posthumously
 - Maximum of one posthumous per year
 - Nomination must be made within one calendar year of the person's passing

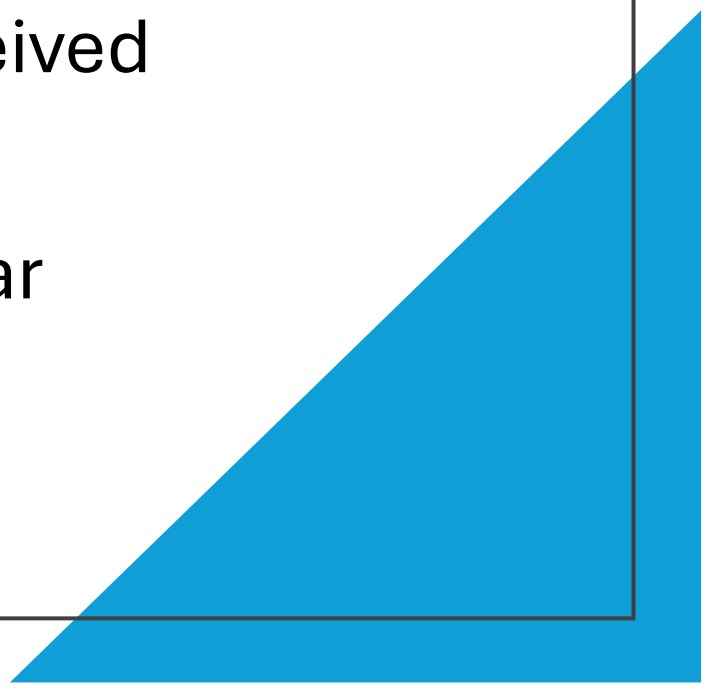


How do I nominate someone?

- Nominations are accepted throughout the year
- Deadline is the last Friday in April each year
- What is required:
 - Nomination Statement
 - Three (3) Testimonial Letters
 - Additional Supporting Material (publications, media stories, work produced)



Selecting Recipients

- Order of Nova Scotia Advisory Council
 - Independent committee recommends appointment
 - Considers all completed nominations received
 - There are no fixed quotas or categories
 - Maximum of ten (10) appointments per year
-

ONS Advisory Council

- A Chair, appointed by the Premier
- The Chief Justice of Nova Scotia, or a judge of the Nova Scotia Court of Appeal or the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia, designated by the Chief Justice
- The Clerk of the Executive Council
- Three members appointed by the Premier, including the president of a university in the province and a member of the Order
- A member appointed by the Leader of the Opposition
- A member appointed by the Leader of the Third Party in the House of Assembly



ONS Insignia

- Presented by the Lieutenant Governor on behalf of The King
- Stylized mayflower bearing the shield of arms of Nova Scotia and a Royal Crown
- Insignia is worn with a blue, white, red, and gold ribbon
- Also presented with a lapel pin for daily wear.
- Members of the Order are entitled to use the post-nominals ONS or ONÉ for francophones

Administration

Continuing by-law/policy development:

- Upcoming: Regional Emergency Management By-law, Budget Committee Terms of Reference, Source Water Protection Advisory Committee Terms of Reference

Green Hydrogen Engagements:

- Monthly/biweekly meetings with Sector Dev, Everwind, and provincial departments
- Water Service Agreement with Developer, Province, and Utility
- Clean Fuels Domestic Use Project is completed, presented to Council, and we are now working towards implementation.
- Easements and Title for lands are completed in Point Tupper
- Water withdrawal renewal for Landrie Lake – Public Hearing was in May, and now we are responding to the 6 IR's that arose from that session.

Economic Development:

- Awarded Basin Rd Subdivision - completed. Working with Developer and At Home Housing on options for the development to increase the availability of affordable Housing options
- PW will be inspecting the sub surface works and coordinate operation and activation with the developer as houses arrive – **completed, now proceeding with minor repair and replacement**
- Working with proponent, land owner and EDPC for new development in Point Tupper – we now have multiple projects, at various stages and will be able share more as they advance in the near future.
- Working with Everwind, EDPC, and LLWU as the new water plant for Everwind prepares to break ground.

Other Ongoing Initiatives:

- Short-term rental and marketing levy coordination with EDPC/Province – Bylaw is being updated
- Flood hazard Project is underway
- Community Climate Resiliency Project is underway
- Meetings with Community Solar Proponents – Community Engagement has been completed for this stage of their development – they are awaiting provincial approval.
- Climate Ready Plan has begun - Federal
- Coastal Cohort for the Community Climate Capacity Grant – ongoing
- Working on the CEEP, Community Energy and Emissions Plan through Clean Foundation and Quest Canada

- Climate Ready Infrastructure Service (CRIS) engineering is completed with scope and pricing ready when funds are available for Unity Drive in our Joint Industrial Park.
- Monthly meetings (CAO roundtable) with the Minister & Deputy Minister for Emergency Mgmt
- Navigate Energy Community sessions are booked for June to engage our community halls to determine interest in the energy assessments. - completed
- Meetings with Regional EMO and CAO's as we adapt and plan for the changes provincially with regards to Emergency Management
- Working with Bell and Rogers on Fibre loop project in Point Tupper –We are now exploring maintaining the asset and it becoming a revenue stream for the Municipality with the advance of a recent development in Point Tupper - ongoing
- Working with At Home to locate suitable lands for future housing projects in Richmond County - ongoing
- Attended Superport in June in Dundee.
- Began and completed NSGEU contract negotiations for a new Collective Bargaining Agreement with our Local in July
- Attended State of the Province at the Chamber Event in August along with tour of Everwind facilities with the Premier.

Energy Sector Development

Strait of Canso Clean Fuels Domestic Use Strategy:

- Steering Committee project wrap-up meeting was held on 11 June.
- Working group established to progress two pilot projects – will commence with meetings in September/October.
- Conversations with companies and other stakeholders are ongoing.

QUEST Canada – Net-Zero Community Accelerator:

- Final draft report has been received and reviewed.
- Consultants are currently implementing last round of feedback and producing the final report.

Community Halls Retrofit Project

- Public information sessions were held on 17 June and 18 June, where community facilities signed up to be part of the project.
- 13 community facilities in Richmond County have signed up to take part in the project.
- An Expression of Interest has been submitted to the Sustainable Communities Challenge Fund, and an application has been submitted to the Climate Ready Infrastructure Service for energy audits and development of retrofit plans.

Community Climate Capacity (CCC) Program:

- Update to the Municipal Climate Action Plan – community engagement was conducted on 17-18 June and 25 July.
- EDPC's Coastal Planning Support Program will be conducting community engagement sessions in Richmond County in October (date TBD).
- Climate Ready Plan Process engagement event will take place in St Peter's on 17 September.
- Supporting other work streams: Clean Fuels Strategy, Roving Municipal Energy Management Service, and QUEST Canada project.

- Molly Foster has pursued a new opportunity and is no longer the Community Navigator. Clean Foundation is currently recruiting for her replacement.

World Hydrogen Summit and Associated Activities

18 May to 22 May 2026

BRIEFING NOTE

The 2026 World Hydrogen Summit & Exhibition in Rotterdam brought together more than 15,000 industry professionals, approximately 2,000 delegates, 700 exhibitors and more than 350 speakers from across the global hydrogen sector.

The Summit is organised by the Sustainable Energy Council (SEC), which is an advisory, events and training provider. SEC promotes clean energy and brings governments, companies and industry leaders together through events such as the World Hydrogen Summit.

The Municipality of the County of Richmond (MOCR) and the Town of Port Hawkesbury (ToPH) attended the Exhibition as part of an Atlantic Canada Delegation that was organized by Newfoundland-based organization EnergyNL.

The two municipalities were joined by Nova Scotia companies, organizations and government entities, including Nova Scotia Department of Energy, EverWind, Waterford Energy Services, and Cape Breton Partnership. The delegation also included representatives from New Brunswick and Newfoundland & Labrador, including Port of Belledune, North Atlantic, Angler Solutions, econext, and Canada-wide organizations such as Invest Canada and Canadian Nuclear Laboratories.

In addition to exhibition activities, representatives from MOCR and ToPH also participated in several site visits and meetings with businesses, ports and local government.

2. Activities

Atlantic Canada Reception

Organized by EnergyNL on behalf of ACOA and the Atlantic Provinces, and was sponsored by North Atlantic.

Tuesday 19 May - the Atlantic Canada Reception was held at the Marriot Hotel in Rotterdam and brought together members of the Atlantic Canada delegation, government representatives and international hydrogen and energy stakeholders.

Chemframe

Chemframe is a Dutch chemical project consultancy that owns and operates a digital platform that helps investors and project developers identify, assess and develop industrial projects from concepts through Final Investment Decision.

Thursday 21 May – Meeting with Senior Consultant at Chemframe to better understand the capabilities of the digital platform. The software is free of charge and can be used to understand the potential inputs and outputs for a long range of chemical products, which would provide important data for investment attraction efforts going forward. There is also an opportunity to register Point Tupper as an 'industrial zone' in the software.

City of Rotterdam & Rotterdam Partners

City of Rotterdam is the municipal unit that governs Rotterdam. It also owns 70% of the Port of Rotterdam. Rotterdam Partners is the investment promotion agency of Rotterdam.

Tuesday 19 May – Meeting with the Economic Development Department at the City along with a representative from Rotterdam Partners. The meeting was also attended by a representative from the Cape Breton Partnership. The meeting included a presentation on hydrogen opportunities in the Strait of Canso, and a discussion on how the municipal units on either side of the Atlantic Hydrogen Corridor can collaborate and share learnings around utilities and infrastructure, social license,

community benefits, safety, etc. A key takeaway from the meeting was the agreement to establish bi-annual update meetings between the municipalities.

Gasunie

Gasunie is Dutch state-owned energy infrastructure company responsible for developing and operating gas and hydrogen infrastructure across the Netherlands and parts of Germany. In hydrogen, Gasunie is the entity responsible for developing a pipeline from Rotterdam to the German border.

*Wednesday 20 May – **Meeting with representative from Gasunie*** to learn more about the completed hydrogen pipeline work, the next phase of work and the current timeline for completion that is being worked towards. The Delta-Rhine Corridor which will connect the Port of Rotterdam to the Dutch hydrogen backbone and ultimately to Germany is currently being planned to be finalized by 2030.

Hydrogen Hub Aachen

Hydrogen Hub Aachen is a German regional initiative under the Aachen Chamber of Industry and Commerce that brings together government, industry, research and businesses across the Aachen region to support hydrogen infrastructure and project development and accelerate the adoption of hydrogen technologies and business models in its industrial base.

*Thursday 21 May – **Meeting with Project Manager at Hydrogen Hub Aachen*** to understand how they went about developing a hub in the context of the Strait of Canso Clean Fuels Domestic Use Strategy. There is a lot of learning from the HHA around co-location of small production pilots and scalable off-take opportunities.

North Sea Port

North Sea Port is the Port Authority organization for the traditional ports of Ghent and Zeeland spanning eight local government entities across both the Netherlands and Belgium.

*Wednesday 20 May – **Meeting with the Commercial Manager at North Sea Port*** focused on green transition activities, port governance and multi-municipal collaboration on port development and promotion. Follow-up meeting was arranged for September.

Port of Antwerp-Bruges

Port of Antwerp-Bruges is the second-largest port in Europe and is a major petro-chemical cluster. The Port is developing activities across the hydrogen value chain, including import, production, distribution, and end-use in industry and transportation.

*Wednesday 20 May – **Meeting with Port of Antwerp-Bruges Chief Business Development & Transition Officer, Tom Hautekie***, along with representatives from the NS Department of Energy, focused on updating both sides on activities at either end of the Atlantic Hydrogen Corridor. The

Port of Antwerp-Bruges Reception in the evening was spent catching up with the Port's Canada team, whom MOCR and Town of Port Hawkesbury have been speaking to since 2024.

*Friday 22 May - **Tour of Port of Antwerp-Bruges*** by bus seeing and learning about hydrogen end-use applications, green hydrogen production facilities, hydrogen pipeline, and general industrial activities in the port.

Port of Rotterdam

Port of Rotterdam is the largest port in Europe and a leading energy and industrial hub. It's hydrogen activities span the full value chain, including production, large-scale imports. Dedicated storage and pipeline infrastructure, and distribution.

*Tuesday 19 May – **Tour of the Port of Rotterdam*** in boat with particular focus on the Maasvlakte section of the port. Highlights included closeup views of container terminals, LNG carriers, an offshore wind monopile staging area, an e-methanol powered feeder carrier, and the largest vessel in the world: The Pioneering Spirit.

*Thursday 21 May – Meeting with **Port of Rotterdam Business Manager, Mark-Simon Benjamins***, along with representatives from the NS Department of Energy, explored ongoing developments and initiatives connected to the Atlantic Hydrogen Corridor on both sides of the Atlantic.

Power2X

Power2X is a Dutch company currently developing large-scale green hydrogen projects and a world-scale SAF facility in Rotterdam.

*Thursday 21 May – **Meeting with Senior Associate at Power2X*** discussing infrastructure requirements and supply chain opportunities related to the clean fuels sector.

Resato

Resato is a Dutch hydrogen technology company specializing in high-pressure hydrogen refuelling infrastructure for cars, buses and trucks.

*Wednesday 20 May – **Meeting with Area Sales Manager at Resato*** to talk about the Strait of Canso Clean Fuels Domestic Use Strategy and particularly on some of the barriers and opportunities associated with progressing some of the proposed pilot projects in the Strategy.

Tech Talks

The World Hydrogen Summit exhibition features a series of 15-minute 'tech talks' in which industry and government representatives provide high-level updates from across the global hydrogen value chain.

*Wednesday 20 May - **How to Develop a Robust Hydrogen Supply Chain in an Uncertain World*** was presented by Haskoning, a Dutch engineering consultancy. The talk focused on how to derisk supply chain development in an uncertain world that needs to decarbonize. They proposed to try

and make as many components in the chain as possible scalable, e.g. production and import, transportation, and deep sea port development.

Wednesday 20 May - **From Pipe to Power: Building a Hydrogen Ready Energy System in Germany** was a panel discussion with representatives from the German federal government, a German gas utility and the Hydrogen Berlin Cluster initiative. Germany has recently adopted its 'Hydrogen Acceleration Act', which simplifies approval procedures by – among other things – bringing together previous fragmented legal streams and enabling natural gas approvals to be applied to hydrogen developments too. The new German government is committed to its 2045 Net Zero goal and wants to ramp up its hydrogen commitments by supporting project and infrastructure development.

Thursday 21 May - **Nova Scotia: Powering the Global Hydrogen Economy** was presented by the Honourable Marco MacLeod, Nova Scotia Minister of Energy and focused on highlighting hydrogen opportunities in Nova Scotia to a global audience.

Waterford Energy Services-Bosch-Hygreen announcement

Waterford Energy Services (WESI) is an Atlantic Canada based engineering and advisory company, Bosch is a major German technology and engineering group, and Hygreen is a Chinese electrolyzer manufacturer.

Wednesday 20 May – **WESI, Bosch and Hygreen announced** a partnership to supply a 1.25MW PEM electrolyzer system for a green hydrogen project in Nova Scotia to be commissioned in the first quarter of 2027.

3. Key Takeaways

The global hydrogen export-import ecosystem is still in the early stages of development

The World Hydrogen Summit demonstrated that the international hydrogen market is progressing, but the infrastructure and commercial relationships required to support large-scale trade are still being established. Ports such as Rotterdam and Antwerp-Bruges are actively developing import terminals, storage, distribution networks and industrial applications, while exporters are working to establish long-term supply chains.

Hydrogen infrastructure is taking longer to develop than originally anticipated, but alternative transportation and distribution solutions are being developed in parallel

Meetings with Gasunie and the Port of Rotterdam demonstrated that Europe's hydrogen pipeline network will take years to fully develop, particularly for connections between major ports and industrial centres. At the same time, Rotterdam and German ports such as Duisburg are exploring the use of existing inland waterways and other infrastructure to move hydrogen carriers such as ammonia into Germany before dedicated hydrogen pipelines are available.

Ports are emerging as critical hubs for the production, import, distribution and use of hydrogen and hydrogen-derived fuels

The visits to Rotterdam and Antwerp-Bruges demonstrated that ports are positioning themselves as much more than points of import and export. Both ports are developing integrated hydrogen ecosystems encompassing production, imports, storage, pipelines, industrial users, shipping and fuel applications.

Securing credible long-term offtake remains critical to unlocking large-scale hydrogen investment

A recurring theme across discussions was that producing hydrogen or ammonia is only one component of establishing a viable project; developers also need customers willing to commit to purchasing the product over the long term.

Near-term hydrogen demand is likely to be driven by established industrial applications before emerging end uses reach significant scale

The Summit highlighted a broad range of potential hydrogen applications, including transportation, shipping, aviation, and power generation. However, the most immediate demand continues to come from existing industrial uses such as ammonia production, refining and chemicals.

Co-location of hydrogen production with local offtake can provide a pathway to early market development

The Hydrogen Hub Aachen discussions and the Resato meeting demonstrated the potential value of developing smaller-scale hydrogen production alongside identified local demand rather than waiting for large-scale production and export infrastructure to be established. This approach can create opportunities to develop local expertise, demonstrate technologies, establish safety and regulatory practices, and build demand.

Regulatory and policy frameworks remain critical enablers—and potential bottlenecks—for hydrogen development

The discussion on Germany's Hydrogen Acceleration Act highlighted how regulatory processes can either facilitate or constrain project development. Across Europe, governments are continuing to establish frameworks covering permitting, certification, infrastructure, subsidies and demand creation, while developers continue to navigate evolving requirements.

Cross-border partnerships between governments, municipalities, ports, industry and technology providers will be essential to developing hydrogen markets

The Summit demonstrated that hydrogen development is not being driven by individual organizations acting independently. The discussions with the City of Rotterdam were particularly relevant in demonstrating how municipalities can establish direct relationships to exchange information on infrastructure, utilities, safety, community benefits and social licence.

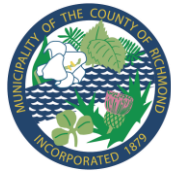

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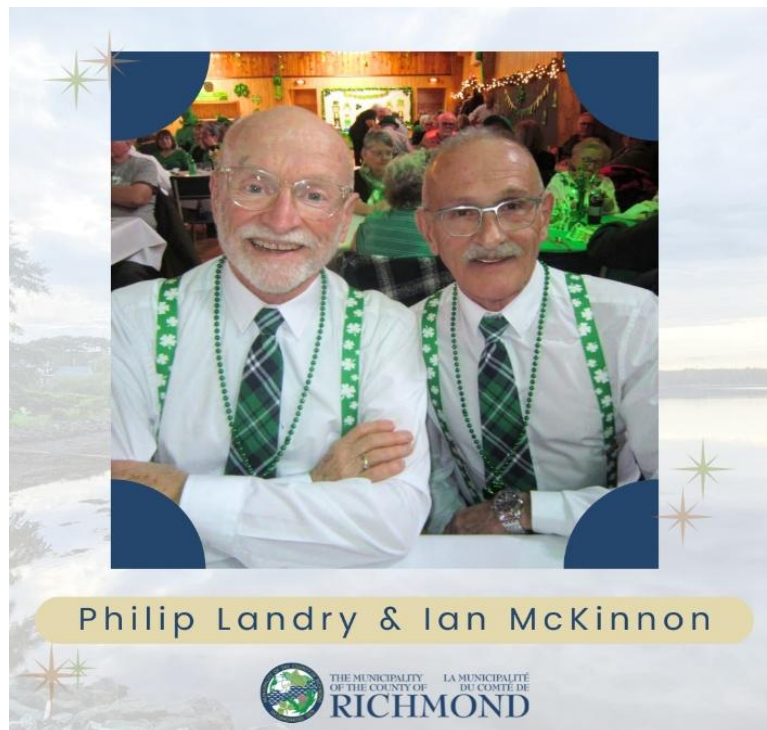

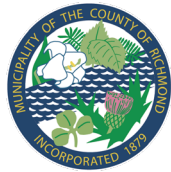

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July 2026 Volunteers of the Month – Joe McNamara

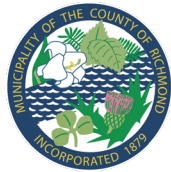

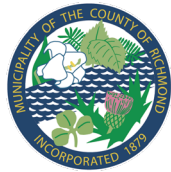

Beyond her military service, Katie was deeply committed to her family and community. While her husband and children were always her greatest priority, she also devoted countless hours to

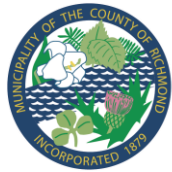

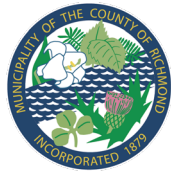

Thank you for your correspondence dated July 7, 2026, regarding student residences at the Nova Scotia Community College (NSCC) Strait Area Campus in Port Hawkesbury. I appreciate you taking the time to shared perspectives regarding student housing capacity and broader housing pressures in the region.

The Province recognizes that access to safe and affordable housing is an important factor in supporting student success, as well as in strengthening communities across Nova Scotia. We are aware that demand for student housing at NSCC campuses can place additional pressure on local rental markets, particularly in rural areas where housing supply may be limited. The work underway by municipalities to address regional housing needs through planning, infrastructure, and partnerships is an important part of the broader response to these challenges.

NSCC plays a key role in developing the skilled workforce needed to support priority sectors across the province, including emerging industries such as renewable energy and marine-related fields. Ensuring that students are able to access training opportunities is an important consideration as we continue to support economic growth and workforce development in all regions of Nova Scotia.

Decisions regarding capital investments, including student residence capacity, require careful consideration of a range of factors, including current and projected demand, available resources, and alignment with provincial priorities. The information you have provided will help inform ongoing discussions with our partners.

Dear Minister Young,

On behalf of the undersigned, we are writing to respectfully request that the Province of Nova Scotia revisit the possibility of constructing an additional student residence at the NSCC Strait Area Campus in Port Hawkesbury.

The existing residence, which houses approximately 50 students, continues to experience demand well beyond its capacity. We understand that the residence could be filled several times over, leaving many students to seek housing in an already strained private rental market across the Strait Area.

At the same time, our municipalities are working diligently to address regional housing shortages through planning changes, infrastructure investments, and partnerships aimed at increasing housing supply. While these efforts are important and ongoing, there is growing concern that limited new housing stock will face additional pressure if increasing numbers of NSCC students must compete within the same rental market as local families, seniors, and workers.

We also note that when the current residence was originally developed, there were discussions around the potential for a sister residence to be built in the future. Given current realities, we believe the time has come to revisit that opportunity.

This request aligns closely with provincial priorities around economic growth, workforce development, and retention. The Strait Area Campus plays a critical role in training students in sectors that are central to Nova Scotia's future, including marine-related industries and the new Wind Turbine Technician program. These programs support key growth sectors identified by the province, including renewable energy, offshore development, transportation, and the marine economy.

Expanding student housing capacity would help strengthen the campus's ability to attract and retain students from across Nova Scotia and beyond, while also reducing pressure on local housing markets. More broadly, it would represent an investment in the workforce

needed to support emerging economic opportunities in our region and throughout the province.

We would welcome the opportunity to discuss this matter further and explore how local municipalities, NSCC, and the province might work collaboratively to support this important expansion.

Thank you for your consideration and continued support for rural Nova Scotia and the Strait Area region.

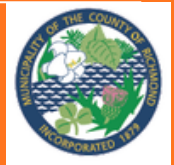

SPOTLIGHT ON COMMITTEES

Planning Advisory/Heritage Committee

This committee, often called the PAC, helps guide planning and development in Richmond County through our land-use bylaws and municipal planning documents. These responsibilities are assigned to Council under the *Municipal Government Act* and are intended to support healthy, vibrant communities while balancing economic development, sustainability, and community needs.

The Committee includes all five Councillors and two members of the public. We typically meet on the first Tuesday of each month, although meeting dates may change depending on the agenda and reports being considered.

As summer comes to a close, I hope everyone has a chance to enjoy the wonderful fall season here in Richmond County. In addition to the many festivals and events that filled July and August, this summer also brought Census takers into our communities as they worked to complete *Census 2026*.

One issue we heard about from Census workers was the difficulty locating some homes because civic numbers were missing or not clearly visible. While that can be an inconvenience for deliveries and visitors, in an emergency it can become a serious safety concern.

I learned that firsthand two years ago when my son had to be rushed to hospital. It was a sickening feeling to have an emergency responder stationed at the top of my driveway to make sure the ambulance didn't drive past because our civic number wasn't clearly displayed.

For less than \$50, we purchased a civic number sign from *Fleur-de-Lis Signs* and placed it at the recommended height—about 4 to 6 feet—and 10 to 15 feet from the road. A good civic number sign is reflective and clearly visible day or night.

If your civic number isn't easy to see from the road, please consider making it a small fall project. It's a simple step that could make a very big difference when every second counts.

Though we do not have regularly scheduled meetings in July and August, Council met on August 18 to attend to items that came up through the summer.

- Rescind the motion passed on May 28, 2026, approving \$5,000 from the *Strategic Initiatives Fund* for Destination Cape Breton's **Port Hastings Visitor Information Centre** proposal for a collaborative operating model, as Destination Cape Breton has advised that the funds are no longer required due to the Province declining the proposal.
