To further this knowledge mobilization project, we want to continue our community engagement events. These events give student interns and biosphere staff and volunteers opportunities to speak about biodiversity of the lake and share unique and special trails around the biosphere. By actively connecting with members of the public and tourists, we encourage people to learn, explore and connect. When people care about the environment, they are willing to invest time and action into protecting it. BLBRA delivers two core initiatives that require ongoing operational support to maintain and expand their impact:

1. Community Engagement and Learning (CEAL) Committee

This committee coordinates three active citizen science programs: Bras d'Or Watch, CoastReach shoreline monitoring, and community-based water monitoring. These initiatives provide opportunities for residents to collect environmental data, build ecological literacy, and actively contribute to understanding and protecting the lake. Two of these programs operate year-round and directly complement municipal environmental and recreational priorities by fostering stewardship and informed community participation. Bras d'Or Watch runs throughout the summer and offers visitors and community members an opportunity to connect with the Bras d'Or Lake shoreline, and nearshore ecosystems. 

1. Nature of operations

Bras d'Or Lake Biosphere Region Association is a non-profit, community based organization that is a model for sustainability and community based economic development, offering a unique blend of natural beauty and cultural heritage. The organization is exempt from income tax in Canada as a registered charitable organization under the Income Tax Act.

2. First time adoption of Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

These financial statements are the first financial statements for which the Organization has applied Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO). The financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2025 were prepared in accordance with ASNPO. Prior year figures have been included with these financial statements for comparative purposes only.

The date of transition to ASNPO is April 1, 2024. The Organization's transition to ASNPO has had no significant impact on the opening retained earnings as at March 31, 2025 or the statement of operations for the year ended March 31, 2025. or the statement of cash flows for the year ended March 31, 2025.

As a result of adoption of these accounting principles, there was no impact on the opening balance sheet of March 31, 2024.

3. Significant accounting policies

The Organization applies the Canadian accounting standards for private enterprises.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash equivalents consist of cash on hand and balances with financial institutions.

Revenue recognition

General

The Organization follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Restricted contributions for capital assets are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Donations and fundraising revenue are recorded as restricted or unrestricted contributions when received, or collection is reasonably assured.

Revenue on retail sales is recognized at the point of sale, when the customer receives and pays for the goods. Provisions are made at the time of sale for warranties and estimated product returns.

3. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Government assistance

The Organization recognizes government assistance toward current expenses in the statement of earnings. When government assistance relates to future expenses, the Organization defers the assistance and recognizes it in the statement of earnings as the related expenses are incurred. When government assistance relates to the acquisition of property and equipment, the Organization defers the assistance and recognizes it in the statement of earnings on the same basis as the related property, plant and equipment is amortized.

Financial instruments

The Organization considers any contract creating a financial asset, liability or equity instrument as a financial instrument, except in certain limited circumstances. The Organization accounts for the following as financial instruments:

- cash and cash equivalents
- receivables
- payables and accruals

Financial instruments in arm's length transactions

Initial measurement

The Organization initially measures financial assets and financial liabilities originating, acquired, issued or assumed in arm's length transactions at fair value.

Subsequent measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities originating, acquired, issued, or assumed in arm's length transactions are subsequently measured as follows:

Derecognition

The Organization removes financial liabilities, or a portion of, when the obligation is discharged, cancelled or expires.

Impairment

Financial assets measured at cost or amortized cost are tested for impairment when indicators of impairment exist at the end of the reporting period. Previously recognized impairment losses are reversed to the extent of the improvement provided the financial asset is not carried at an amount, at the date of the reversal, greater than the amount that would have been the carrying amount had no impairment loss been recognized previously. The amounts of any write-downs or reversals are recognized in net income.

3. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Use of estimates

Management reviews the carrying amounts of items in the financial statements at each balance sheet date to assess the need for revision or any possibility of impairment. Many items in the preparation of these financial statements require management's best estimate. Management determines these estimates based on assumptions that reflect the most probable set of economic conditions and planned courses of action.

These estimates are reviewed periodically and adjustments are made to net income as appropriate in the year they become known.

4. Financial instruments

The Organization is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments. The following analysis provides a measure of the Organization's risk exposures and concentrations at March 31, 2025.

(a) Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will cause a financial loss for the other party by failing to discharge an obligation. The Organization's main credit risks relate to its accounts receivable and notes receivable. The entity provides credit to its clients in the normal course of its operations.

(b) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Organization will encounter difficulty in meeting the obligations associated with its financial liabilities. The Organization is exposed to this risk mainly in respect of its accounts payable.



Information:

We have discovered one or two small discrepancies between what is saved on our ABCC matrix and what is posted on our website on our ABCC page. We will provide an update to Council on these so that we can read into the record who actually sits on what ABCC and be sure the website is accurate.

Further, we will review if there are ABCCs where we could declare alternates, or if any ABCCs are no longer active or expected to become inactive.

Finally, Section 18.1 of our Committees Policy, under Reporting and Communicating, reads as follows:

At least quarterly, ABCC progress reports shall be presented to Council at Committee of the Whole meetings by a designated ABCC member (member of Council, staff, and/or citizen appointee). The timing of the quarterly reports will be influenced as appropriate by the meeting frequency/activity of the ABCC. If a committee meets at least once, it shall be included in the next quarter reports.

We are looking for some direction from Council about whether you'd like me to start assigning dates that Committee members could present OR whether we would like to refer the Committees Policy to the Bylaw and Policy Committee for review.

Background

On January 13th, 2026, Andy Thompson, a Community Developer with Aging Well Nova Scotia, presented to Council a program focused on conducting energy assessments, retrofits, and upgrades through Navigate Energy and the NetZero Community Buildings Program.

Proposal

We will apply for CRIS (Climate Ready Infrastructure Service) funding once we know how many units are enrolling and also engage Navigate Energy to complete the assessments. We have two workshops already arranged in June to meet with the communities in Richmond to see which are interested in having the assessments completed through this program.

As discussed in the presentation, two key elements are required to help make this program successful:

1. **A Community Champion** - a member of Council was suggested.
2. **A dedicated Navigator** - a single point of contact for all halls interested in the program, we are hoping to have this person identified through our two workshops with the communities.

Request

It is Staff's request that Council determine who will be their representative, if Council is still willing to pursue this endeavor, on this project to help bring these energy assessments and retrofits to our eligible community halls through this Program.

- Approve the Recommendation and select a representative from Council
- Decline the Recommendation and not proceed with the program

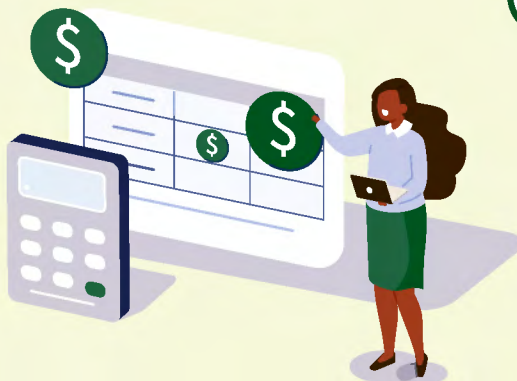
