Dear Councillors,

I am writing on behalf of our community to express a serious concern regarding traffic safety at the Petit de Grat baseball field. Over the past season, and particularly during the recent provincial weekend, we observed several drivers ignoring the “Please Slow Down” signs that were installed this year. Despite these efforts, vehicles continue to pass through the area at unsafe speeds, creating a significant risk for players, children, and families who regularly gather at the field.

As this facility is a central hub for recreation and community events, we believe stronger measures are necessary to ensure the safety of everyone who uses it. We respectfully request the installation of two speed bumps in key areas near the field. This would provide an effective physical reminder for drivers to reduce their speed and prioritize the safety of pedestrians.

The addition of speed bumps would not only protect our children and community members but would also demonstrate the County’s commitment to supporting safe and accessible recreation spaces for all.
