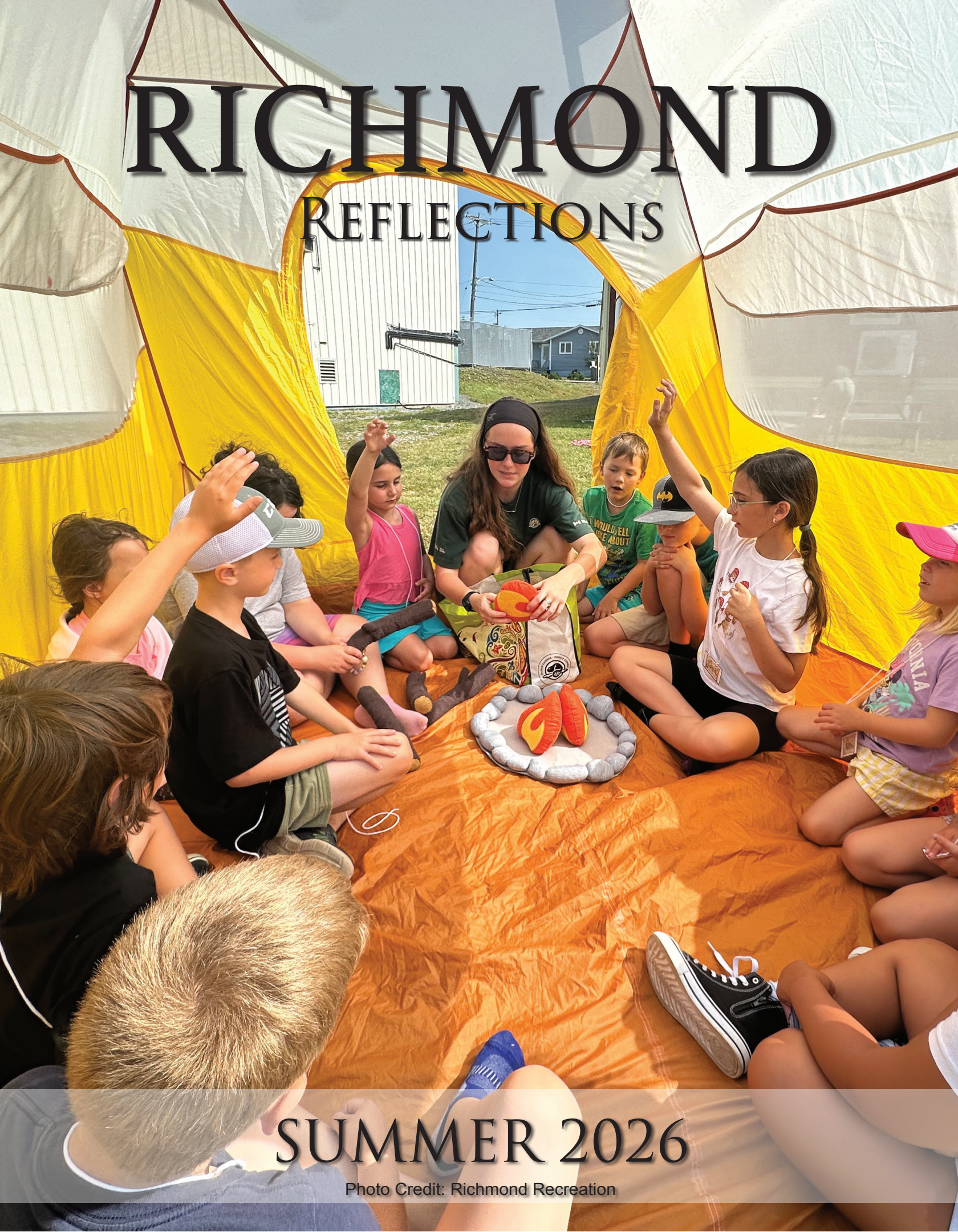

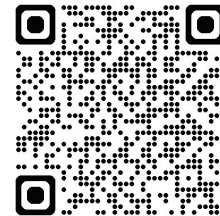

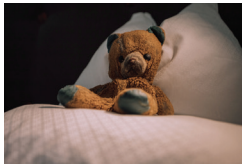

Point Michaud Beach Provincial Park



Point Michaud Beach Provincial Park is an exceptional 3-km (2-mi) sandy beach located at **3796 Point Michaud Road, Point Michaud**. This provincially operated park features a boardwalk for easy beach access, picnic tables for day-use comfort, a change house, vault toilets, and on-site parking. During July and August, designated swimming areas are supervised by Nova Scotia Lifeguard Services.

Nova Scotia Lifeguard Service

The Nova Scotia Lifeguard Services began supervising this beach in partnership with the Municipality of Richmond County in 2010. Point Michaud Beach's supervised swimming area is marked by red and yellow flags on either side of the beach. Point Michaud Beach will be supervised daily from 10:00 am - 6:00 pm, from July 1 – August 30



Beach Accessibility & Adaptive Equipment

The Municipality of the County of Richmond, with support from Nova Scotia Parks, offers accessible beach equipment at Point Michaud Provincial Park.



Visitors are welcome to stop by the Recreation Surf Hut during regular operating hours to inquire about the free use of a Mobi-Chair, and adaptive safety equipment from Life Jacket-Adapted Inc.

24th Annual Point Michaud Summer Surf Program

Hours of Operation

Recreation Surf Hut is open from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm, 7 days a week, from July 2 to August 22. Rental equipment is available during all operating hours. All rental items must be returned by 4:30 pm each day to avoid late fees.

Point Michaud Youth Surf Club

Youth Surf Club is designed for youth who are new to surfing or looking to build and progress their ocean skills in a safe, supportive, and fun environment. The program focuses on developing confidence in the water, improving surf technique, and building strong ocean awareness and safety skills.

Participants will be introduced to surfing fundamentals and gradually progress through skill development under the guidance of an experienced coach. In addition to surfing, youth may also be introduced to a variety of ocean-based activities such as body surfing, boogie boarding, skim boarding, paddle boarding, kayaking, and snorkeling.

The program includes all necessary equipment such as wetsuit and surfboard rental for the duration of the summer sessions. **Youth Surf Club runs on select dates throughout July and August. 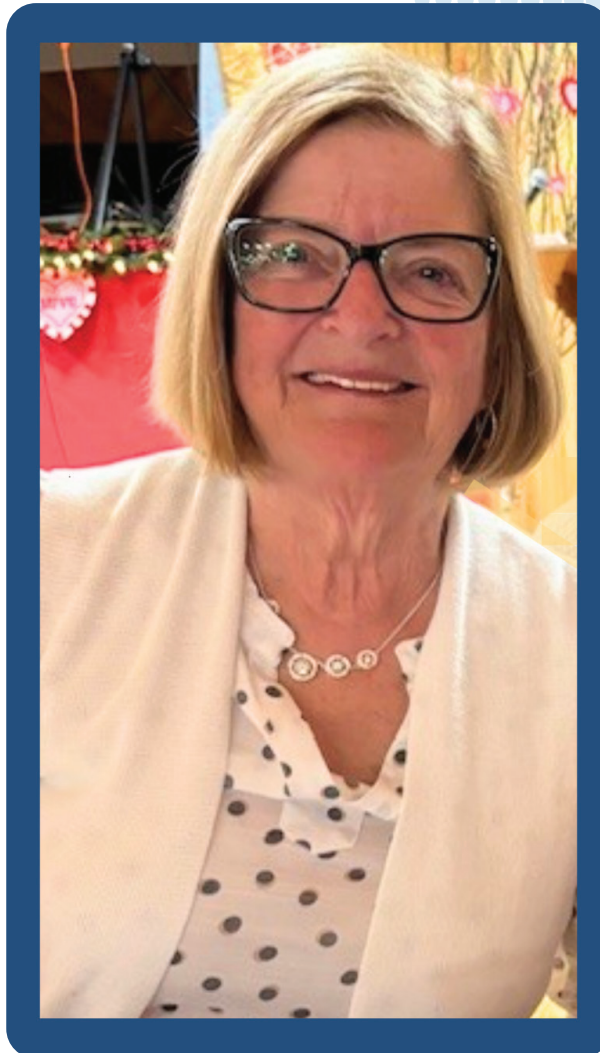

Wipes & Personal Hygiene Products Clog Sewer Lines!

Many household products are labeled and marketed as DISPOSABLE and/or FLUSHABLE; many baby and adult personal hygiene products, along with household wipes and cleaning towelettes are labeled both disposable and flushable. While these products may be marketed as a convenience item in this way, the truth is that these types of items have the ability to clog not only the sewer line on your property, but also the public sewer system and pump stations in our serviced areas.

Unlike toilet paper, these products DO NOT break down once they are flushed. They can cause blockages in your sewer line, especially older pipelines that may have grease, roots, or other obstructions already existing. Repair of a private sewer line can be inconvenient and costly for the property owner. Property owners are responsible for maintenance of the sewer line from their home up to the road right-of-way. When these products make their way into the public sewer system they collect together causing very large obstructions and clogs in the mains and get tangled in pump stations requiring repair or replacement of equipment. Ultimately, increased costs to maintain the central sewerage systems are passed on to customers through sewer rates.

How Can We Help...

The following items should **NEVER** be flushed into the sewer system:

Disinfecting/surface wipes	Mop or "Swiffer" type refills
Baby wipes	Paper towels
Jewelry wipes	Pet care wipes
Cosmetic wipes	First Aid wipes
Disposable diapers or diaper liners	Bio-pads (nursing home, home health care, etc.)
Cotton swabs	Feminine hygiene products
Toilet cleaning pads	ANY Moist type towelettes
ANY CONSUMER ITEM THAT IS NOT TOILET PAPER	

Save yourself and your Sewer Utility from costly repairs and/or replacement bills. **Do not flush the listed items; place them in the trash, not the toilet.**

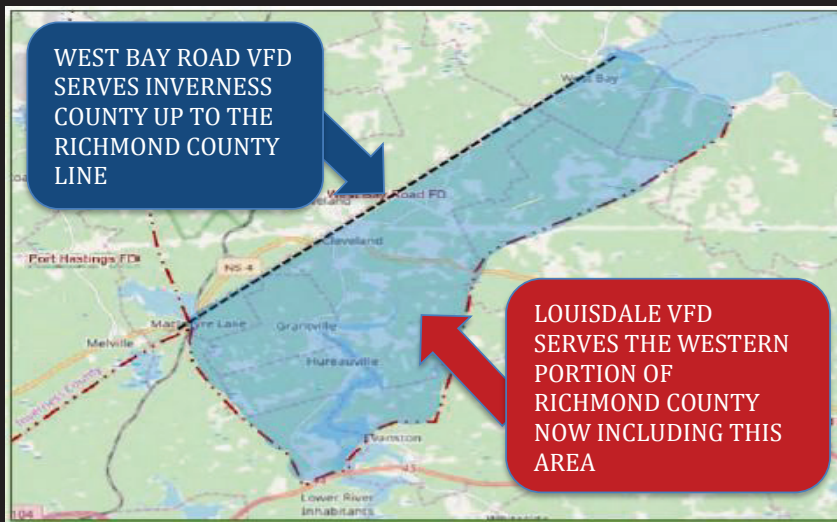

Department of Finance and Taxation

The Finance Department is responsible for coordinating all the financial activities of the Municipality of the County of Richmond. The major areas of responsibilities of the Department are property taxation, other source revenues, accounts payable, payroll, budgeting, accounting and financial management. **The Municipality of the County of Richmond's fiscal year runs April 1 - March 31.**

Tax Payment Methods

Tax payments may be made at the Municipal Tax Office located at 2357 Highway 206, in Arichat, by presenting your tax bill to the Tax Clerk. The office is open Monday through Friday between 8:30 am and 4:00 pm.

The Municipality offers Debit Card payments.

PLEASE NOTE: VISA, Mastercard, American Express, etc. are NOT accepted.

Online and telephone banking are other alternatives for paying property tax bills through most financial institutions.

Land Transfer Tax

The Municipality of the County of Richmond has a Deed Transfer Tax of 1.5%. The Deed Transfer Tax is collected on the Municipality's behalf by the Province of Nova Scotia at the Registry of Deeds.

Tax and Area Rates

The 2025-2026 Residential tax rate for the Municipality of the County of Richmond is \$0.85 per \$100 of assessment.

The Commercial tax rate for 2025-2026 is \$2.15 per \$100 of assessed value. Area rates are also added. See our website for a detailed breakdown.

Property Tax Billing and Interest Rates

The Municipality's tax bills are issued on the 1st of April and September and are due on the first working day of June and November.

All taxes not paid by the due date accrue interest at a rate of 18% per annum (1.5% per month). The Municipality sends out approximately 12,000 annual tax bills.

The Mi'kmaq has celebrated the annual feast of Saint Anne in Potlotek First Nation, Nova Scotia, on a tiny island called Miniku since 1742. The Saint Anne's Mission has been recognized as a National Historic Site of Canada since 2002.

The Saint Anne's Mission is also a traditional meeting place for the Mi'kmaq Grand Council (Sante Mawiomi) – They come together and discuss issues affecting the Mi'kmaq Nation. The Grand Council (represents the 7 districts) and gives a yearly address on Sunday during the Saint Anne Mission. Miniku (the little island) is the oldest reserve in Cape Breton Island.

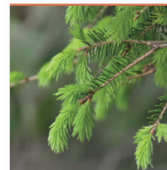

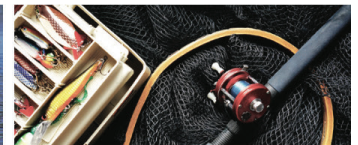
